MEMORANDUM

To: National Control Council

Subject: Summary of Proposed Changes to the ASRF Constitution

Date:

Introduction

This memo outlines the material changes between the current and proposed Constitutions and explains the purpose of each amendment for your information and consideration.

Summary of Key Changes and Purposes

1. Removal of Western Australia-Specific Provisions

Change: All provisions and references that treated Western Australia separately from other divisions have been removed.

Purpose: This unites administration and governance processes for all divisions under a single framework, reflecting the current operations and ensuring consistency and fairness for all states and territories.

2. Revision of Dispute Resolution Process

Change: The proposed Constitution shortens and simplifies the dispute resolution, that allows for more internal dispute resolution processes.

Purpose: The new process makes resolving disputes more accessible and less formal, encouraging prompt and amicable solutions without the need for extended procedures.

4. Change to Membership Termination Process

Change: The power to terminate a member's membership, which previously could be exercised either by Directors or by Members in a General Meeting, is now vested solely in the Directors by ordinary resolution. The time frames for termination due to unpaid fees have also been shortened (from up to 12 months to 2-3 months depending on context).

Purpose: This adjustment centralises member discipline and ensures fair, consistent decision-making, reducing the risk of arbitrary or improper terminations at the general meeting level. Procedural safeguards—such as notice of allegations and the right to respond—remain in place.

5. Governance and Administrative Modernisation

Change: Outdated or redundant language has been removed, and procedures for meetings, voting, and communications have been modernised to reflect digital practice.

Purpose: To bring the Constitution in line with current law and technological realities, making it easier to follow and compliant with the Corporations Act.

6. Confirmation of Not-for-Profit Status

Change: The requirement that ASRF must remain a not-for-profit is restated and clarified.

Purpose: This is essential for regulatory compliance and for affirming the ASRF's core mission to members and the broader community.

Conclusion

The proposed changes are intended to provide a modern, accessible, and effective governance structure for ASRF, enabling it to better serve members and advance the sport into the future.

Dear members of the NCC,

Please see email below to be read at your next DC.

Dear Members,

We write to inform you of an important governance issue that has affected the representation of Western Australia within the Australian Street Rod Federation Ltd (ASRF).

Under the ASRF Constitution, the Western Australian Divisional Council was separately incorporated in 2018 as Australian Street Rod Federation of Western Australia Inc (ASRFWA Inc). This entity was recognised under the ASRF Constitution as the Divisional as the Divisional Council member for Western Australia and held voting rights and representation at the national level.

It came to ASRF Ltd's attention that ASRFWA Inc currently had no internal members registered to it, and accordingly, we held serious concerns about how was is functioning and making decisions, including:

How it purported to represent the interests of street rodding clubs and members in Western Australia;

How it could validly make decisions, pass resolutions, or appoint representatives in the absence of any internal membership; and

The ongoing legitimacy of its role as the Divisional Council Member for Western Australia under the ASRF Ltd Constitution.

Despite this, ASRFWA Inc technically remained the registered Divisional Council Member of ASRF Ltd under the terms of the Constitution. This situation created a significant governance concern, particularly regarding whether ASRFWA Inc is lawfully and appropriately acting on behalf of the Western Australian street rodding community.

ASRF Ltd's priority is to ensure that the interests of street rodding clubs and members in Western Australia are properly represented, and that there is an effective and accountable governance framework in place. We actively reviewed this issue and considered the appropriate steps to ensure proper representation and engagement for the WA street rodding community moving forward.

As such the NCC voted unanimously to remove the separate entity 'ASRFWA Inc' from the constitution and request that the WA members create a Divisional Council and

committee to conform with every other state in Australia.

Thank you for your attention to this important matter.
